

## Hutchinson Central Technical High School English 3R – Summer Reading Requirements

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### Read:

Moore, Wes. *The Other Wes Moore: One Name, Two Fates*.

### Must do:

In several respects Wes Moore (Rhodes Scholar) and Wes Moore (felon) shared very similar childhoods. In other respects, there were fundamental differences in their upbringing and the values imparted to them as children. In a well-developed essay, consider an argument that can be made in support of your point of view as to why one Wes Moore succeeded, while the other Wes Moore ended up in jail for life. For instance, did the opportunities, values, and choices of each man set the direction of their lives, or was chance involved? Other questions to consider are: To what extent did environment, family and upbringing, and personal character shape each man's life? Note: you do NOT necessarily have to answer these questions in particular but they are meant to serve as a guide that will assist you in developing your claim (your point of view, position, etc.). Feel free to create your own question that leads to your position, or point of view, regarding why one Wes Moore succeeded, while the other Wes Moore ended up in jail for life.

In writing your essay which develops an evidence-based claim, be sure to use at least 4 specific examples from the text that supports your point of view/position. Please make sure to properly cite your evidence from the text, using page number(s).

### **Where can I get a copy of the book?**

There are several options available. You can certainly purchase a copy from any bookstore or through Amazon. The benefit of selecting this option is that you can annotate the pages.

Another option is to borrow the book from the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library ([www.buffalolib.org](http://www.buffalolib.org)). Through the Buffalo & Erie County Public Library, the book is available as an EBOOK download and at the following locations: Audubon Library, Central Library, Clearfield Library, Crane Branch Library, Dudley Branch Library, East Delavan Branch Library, Eggerstville-Snyder Library, Frank E. Merriweather Library, Hamburg Library, Julia Boyer Reinstein Library, Kenmore Library, Orchard Park Library, and the West Seneca Library. Before visiting a library either call ahead or go online to check for availability. Keep in mind that the longer you wait to get the book the least likely you will be to find it available.
